- a collection of historical events of the case studies.


How

The definition of a SHELTER ontology was identified by reviewing the existing literature. The other four elements (i.e. regulatory framework, good practices, tools, historical events) were framed through data gathering templates, specifically structured to facilitate the collection of existing knowledge.

Tool | Results


- the heterogeneous knowledge gathered through the literature review process and critical analysis of European Union (EU)-funded initiatives
