



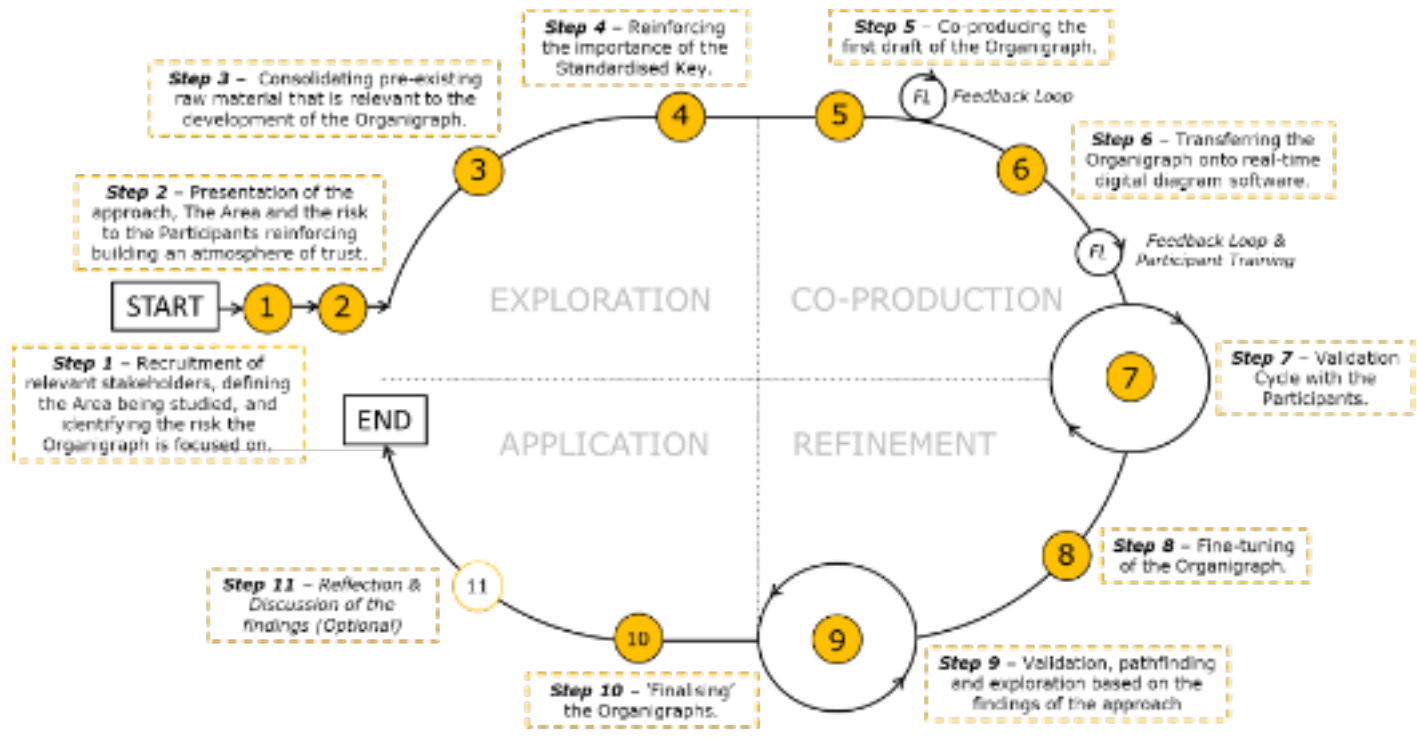
Building from the Organigraphs 'What did we learn?'

This project has received funding from the European Union's Horizon 2020 research and innovation programme under grant agreement No 821282

This poster explores the outcomes of the Organigraph as a tool for exploring and analysing Disaster Risk Management (DRM) governance structures. The Organigraph was initially developed to map the organisational structure of businesses but has recently been adapted to map governance. Within the SHELTER project, researchers utilised an innovative qualitative semi-empirical research approach to co-create DRM governance structures across five SHELTER Open labs (OLs). Critically, the outcomes of this work were more significant than the sum of its parts. The Methodology and OL-specific outputs have stimulated further discussions and broader avenues of research—both within the SHELTER Project and beyond. Including the Organigraphs ability to pinpoint opportunity spaces or weaknesses. The potential of the tool as a negotiation platform to explore stakeholder responsibilities around Cultural Heritage (CH) conservation. Finally, the tool's potential to facilitate a greater understanding of DRM governance as a whole.

How

The methodology that led to the co-creation of the Organigraphs consisted of four iterative phases: 'Consolidation', 'Co-production', 'Application' and 'Refinement'. The approach took place between NOV2020 - NOV2021. While the four phases remained constant, The OL employed different methods tailored to their resources The approach encourage experts to engage with the Organigraphs on their terms yielded outcomes greater than the sum of its parts.



Tool | Results

The Organigraphs are a viable tool for mapping DRM governance. They provide the ability to proactively identify and adapt governance in the preparedness phase of DRM. They have the potential to inform a platform for negotiating the responsibilities of different stakeholders regarding CH preservation based on their role in DRM governance. Finally, the Organigraphs raise context-specific questions.

Functionality

The SHELTER Operational was a core feature of the entire research approach adapted to create the Organigraphs. However, this did not stop with the submission of the project deliverable. Researchers are now exploring the outputs of the Organigraphs within the wider context of the SHELTER Project. They are attempting to continue adapting these outputs within the SHELTER Project and beyond.
